 - a. Chair shared that the fee and funding for programs increases by the Higher Education Price Index (HEPI). She also recommended reviewing official communication from Presidents Office which spoke to funded enrolment.
- 2. Request to explain FTES into terms for students to better understand
 - Full Time Equivalent Student (FTES) translates to 15 units- the average unit load is below 15 so headcount does not exactly match FTES. Enrollment Services shares the headcount based on the FTES funded by the Chancellor's Office.
- iii. Voting on approval of budget will take place at next scheduled meeting (April 11th)

- 6. NEW BUSINESS:
 - a. Alternative Consultation Process
 - This process has historically consisted of open forums which had resulted in ineffective student engagement. Chair recommended discovering new avenue of promoting better student engagement, to collect a broader source of student opinion.

 - Member suggested involving AS executive offices and University Life Counsel.

SUBJECT: Use of Alternative Consultation Process for Fall 2025 Fee Proposal

SDSU is considering the increase of the Instructionally Related Activities (IRA) Fee, a current mandatory Category II Fee (fees that must be paid to enroll in or attend the university). The proposed increase would support Athletics, support for intramural sports clubs, and student athlete healthcare services. Currently 76% of the IRA fee is allocated to Athletics; however, expenses and requirements related to nutrition, technology, facilities, equipment, travel, compliance, and training have increased at a rate much higher than the Higher Education Price Index (HEPI).

In accordance with the Education Code and Executive Order 1102, this fee proposal is subject to either an advisory student referendum or other advisory alternative consultation mechanism as proposed by the campus.

An alternative consultation is the chosen mechanism for this fee for the following reasons:

- Alternative consultation also allows us to ensure that student perspectives across varying demographics are equitable in their representation.
- A referendum would not allow us to fully understand the rationales for support or opposition. The consultation process, by contrast, allows for considerations of the complexity of the support and/or opposition to the proposed fee in qualitative not just quantitative terms, and allows for in-depth conversations to be scheduled with students, staff, and faculty to inform future steps.

The alternative consultation will occur throughout Fall 2025 with a goal of completing the process in December.
