Per David Ely's request, T'Ante Sims substituted as CFAC Chair for this meeting.

The meeting was called to order at 2:03 P.M. by T'Ante Sims, CFAC Chair (substitute).

Informational Items

a. SDSU Georgia Summer Session Fee

Mr. Sims introduced the SDSU Georgia Summer Session Fee which was signed by President Roush on August 30, 2017. Ms. Wong-Nickerson delivered a brief explanation and history of the SDSU Georgia Program. She further explained that the program has grown over the past two years and an extra spring session was originally planned to help the students fulfill course requirements; however, the session did not start in time during the spring semester and actually started in the summer. Ms. Wong Nickerson explained that the students had already paid for the spring semester, so the purpose of the SDSU Georgia Summer Session Fee (\$46 per unit) was to cover administrative costs associated with administering the classes during the summer. Ms. Little reminded the committee that this is a Category V fee for a self-supporting continued education program and is not a state-funded matriculated program. She further explained that the fee is simply an informational item for the committee as the President has the authority to approve such fees. Ms. Little asked if there were questions; there were none.

b. Administrative Citation Fee

Mr. Sims introduced and explained the Administrative Citation Fee which was signed by President Roush on September 7, 2017. He explained that the fee (\$75) is being implemented to enforce the campus rules regarding bicycling, skateboarding, and smoking and that it applies to everyone on campus: students, staff, faculty, and visitors and will become effective October 1, 2017. Ms. Wong-Nickerson added that the initial approach has been using social reinforcement but it has not been working perfectly and this fee will help strengthen enforcement. She further added that the fee is for an administrative citation rather than a criminal citation.

Mr. Uwakwe asked what effect the citation would have on visitors; Ms. Wong-Nickerson responded that the University Police have the authority to cite visitors to the campus and unpaid citations would be sent to a collection agency.

Ms. Shutovska asked how the fee will be communicated to students; Mr. Thomas responded that there will be a social media campaign, signage on campus, and initial warnings to inform students of the new fee. Ms. Girard asked if the current citation for a bike lane violation is a misdemeanor; Mr. Thomas responded that currently the citation is a misdemeanor with a fee of \$188 and requires two court appearances, so the new fee will save violators time and money.

Requests

a. IRA/SSF Travel Reimbursement Proposal

Mr. Sims introduced the IRA/SSF Travel Reimbursement Proposal and asked Dr. Prislin to elaborate. Dr. Prislin explained that many of the SSF proposals are for conference attendance, research presentations, or other events/activities that require travel. She mentioned that many students have complained that the

current travel reimbursement rates of \$60 for lodging and \$20 for meals (each per day) are inadequate and make travel unaffordable.

Ms. Wong-Nickerson asked if the reimbursement rates had recently been increased; Ms. Little responded that in 2014-15 the rate was increased from \$37 to the current \$80 (\$60 for lodging, \$20 for meals).

Dr. Prislin noted that while additional funds may be available to support travel, more often than not students will not get the funding thus preventing the student from traveling. She reminded the committee that while increasing the travel reimbursement rates would decrease the number of approved proposals, those that are funded would be reasonably funded.

Ms. Wong-Nickerson asked if there is a proposal for the rate increase; Dr. Prislin responded that there is a proposal to increase the lodging reimbursement rate to \$80 per day and the meal reimbursement rate to \$30 per day. She further noted that the increase is justified based on the average daily rate of a hotel in the U.S. currently at \$130. Ms. Little added that the reimbursement is based on actual cost up to the maximum. Ms. Girard expressed her concern that the proposed \$80 still seemed low as sometimes that amount would not cover even half of the lodging; Dr. Prislin responded that it is not uncommon for students to share rooms and each student would be covered up to the \$80 rate. Dr. Prislin further addressed the concern by noting that there needs to be a balance; fully funding travel would greatly reduce the number of students who would be able to travel so the conclusion was that \$80 seemed to be adequate even though in some cases students may have to pay some costs out of pocket. Mr. Ebiriekwe also noted that in some cases everything is covered under an all-inclusive fee (i.e. registration, airfare, etc.). Mr. Diaz added that the proposed increase will hopefully encourage more proposals.

Mr. Sims asked if there was a motion to move the proposal to an action item. Ms.Girard made the motion which was seconded by Mr. Ebiriekwe. The motion was approved unanimously.

Mr. Sims asked if further discussion was needed. Ms. Girard commented that increased travel reimbursement rates would encourage more students to travel.

The motion was approved unanimously.

To whom it may concern:

The School of Speech Language and Hearing Sciences is requesting approval for student course fees in support of the MA clinical training program in Speech-Language Pathology (SLP).

→ US News and World report has ranked our MA program in SLP #24 (out of 249 accredited programs) in the nation and we rank #1 in California.

Our **Speech-Language Clinic** serves to two purposes:

- a) To train graduate students enrolled in the 2-year (5 semester) MA program for Speech-Language Pathology (the entry-level degree for a certified/licensed Speech-Language Pathologist). The Program provides professional multifaceted preparation for a career in speech-language pathology, with a strong commitment to theoretical and research components. It provides supervised clinical experiences that prepare graduates who are highly competent to manage a variety of speech and language disorders, across the lifespan, and from culturally and linguistically diverse populations. The academic and clinical preparation ensures that graduates of the program have the competencies to excel as independent clinicians and as members of collaborative clinical teams.
- b) The on-campus clinic also serves the San Diego community through diagnostic and intervention speech and language services. We see clients across the lifespan (pediatric to elderly) and those clients include faculty, staff and students at San Diego State University.

Summary of request:

- It costs >\$51,000 to run our on-campus clinical program for each cohort of graduate students
- We used to cover these costs through a sliding scale fee-for-service
- We can no longer charge fees for services per Federal law
- We wish to keep our on-campus clinic open to serve both the San Diego Community and SDSU faculty and students but cannot do so without financial assistance
- We are asking students to cover ~1% of those costs to allow us to continue this important (and top ranked) clinical service
- Course fees will include mandatory expenses for background checks, certification,
 Calipso, etc. and will allow students to use their financial aid to pay for these required costs
- It is more convenient for students as opposed to making them make individual arrangements for payments to outside sources. We will coordinate the services for them!



A brief background

Historically, we operated on a fee-for-service model with a sliding scale for those clients who demonstrated need. That means that for intervention services, for example (which are individual treatment sessions, multiple times per week), clients were charged \$250/semester [which is considerably low compared to fees charged in the community]. However, if need was demonstrated, some clients paid as little as \$15/semester for services. Through these fees, we were able to sustain the costs involved in running this program.

However, Federal laws (Medicare) have now mandated that if an on-campus clinic sees *any* Medicare-eligible clients, we must have a specific ratio of *student:clinical supervisor* in order to charge fees-for-services. Currently, we comply with our national accreditation body (ASHA) and thus operate at a **3:1** ratio. Medicare rules require a **1:1** ratio. There are not enough resources at SDSU to hire the number of clinical supervisors we would need to comply with Federal law. We therefore can no longer charge fees for services. While this is wonderful for our clients, <u>it makes operating our clinic unsustainable</u>.

We have sought guidance from our sister CSU clinics to see how they sustain their on-campus clinics. We learned that for many years, almost all CSU's that have an on-campus clinic, except SDSU, charges a program fee for the MA program in Speech-Language Pathology in order to run their clinics (even when they could also charge for services). These fees ranged from \$150/semester/student to \$500/semester/student throughout the course of study.

Again, in past years, we have avoided adding to the financial burden of our students by using the funds generated by our client fees to support our clinic operations. This is no longer an option for us. Our options are to (1) close down our on-campus clinic, which would be a huge disservice to the San Diego community and SDSU faculty and students, or (2) charge a nominal fee to our MA students to help deflect a small portion of the costs while we look for sustainable donors to maintain operations. We are hoping to keep our on-campus clinic open and continue to provide an important service to SDSU and the San Diego Community.

Below we provide a **portion** of costs involved in running the clinic operations. Our goal is to charge a small fee for <u>four</u> of the <u>five</u> semesters to MA students who are enrolled so that over

the course of their 2-year training program, we can deflect a small percentage of costs. We also note here that one issue our students have faced over the years is large out of pocket expenses that are mandated for our program (such as background checks, fingerprinting, etc.). We have built in to the fee request costs that students **have** to

Obviously, this will not in any way cover the expenses listed above which total \$51,113 (let alone the numerous other expenses not listed).

Each student's fees will cover <u>approximately 1%</u> of the costs to run our clinic (less than half of the total costs for the cohort across the two years). On the next page, we breakdown the \$150/course fee in relation to the items above noting that we tried to spread the costs across the two years that a student is enrolled in the program in order to keep the fees low.

We believe this nominal fee is more than reasonable. We wish we did not have to request it, but we believe the costs far outweigh the consequences of having to close our clinic. We hope you agree.

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The School of Speech Language and Hearing Sciences is requesting approval for student course fees in support of the MA clinical training program in Speech-Language Pathology (SLP).

Our options are to (1) close down our on-campus clinic, which would be a huge disservice to the San Diego community and SDSU faculty and students, or (2) charge a nominal fee to our MA students to help deflect a small portion of the costs while we look for sustainable donors to maintain operations. We are hoping to keep our on-campus clinic open and continue to provide an important service to SDSU and the San Diego Community.

Below we provide a **portion** of costs involved in running the clinic operations. Our goal is to charge a small fee for <u>four</u> of the <u>five</u> semesters to MA students who are enrolled so that over

the course of their 2-year training program, we can deflect a small percentage of costs. We also note here that one issue our students have faced over the years is large out of pocket expenses that are mandated for our program (such as background checks, fingerprinting, etc.). We have built in to the fee request costs that students **have** to

pay anyway so as to reduce the out of pocket burden—by including these charges in the fees,



they can use their financial aid money to pay for these mandated expenses. Details regarding the expenses listed below can be found in our application packet(s).

We are asking for \$150/semester for four of the five semesters of the MA program for a total of **\$600/student**, which will total <u>\$22,800 for all 38 enrolled students across their two years in the program</u>. Obviously, this will not in any way cover the expenses listed above which total \$51,113 (let alone the numerous other expenses not listed).

Each student's fees will cover <u>approximately 1%</u> of the costs to run our clinic (less than half of the total costs for the cohort across the two years). On the next page, we breakdown the \$150/course fee in relation to the items above noting that we tried to spread the costs across the two years that a student is enrolled in the program in order to keep the fees low.

We believe this nominal fee is more than reasonable. We wish we did not have to request it, but we believe the costs far outweigh the consequences of having to close our clinic. We hope you agree.
