Martin stated that these fees are primarily for the students, who are in the Music Education program. A MOTION by Reilly to approve the New Range of Fees for Lab and Course Materials and Fee Increase for Nutrition Courses. Kramer seconded the motion. The MOTION PASSED unanimously.
