IVC Earthquake Repair Library Exterior and Auditorium Exterior and Interior One-Time Funding Request

On April 4, 2010 the SDSU Imperial Valley Campus (IVC) at Calexico suffered a 7.2 magnitude earthquake. The quake was centered in Baja California, 40 miles south of the U.S.-Mexican border. This high magnitude quake along with a substantial string of aftershocks of 4.0-5.0 magnitude over the next several months caused damage to IVC campus buildings.

At the April 28, 2011 PBAC meeting \$305,000 in one-time funding was approved for interior cracks that required paint and repair in all IVC buildings and for exterior stucco repair to the smaller buildings.

Additional funding is requested for previously deferred repairs of damages from the 2010 earthquake as follows:

IVC Library/Library Addition Exterior Repairs (Stucco/Paint):

\$ 66,000

IVC Auditorium Exterior (Stucco/Paint) and Interior (Drywall/Paint):

\$195,000

Total request:

\$261,000

The University requested and received FEMA reimbursement in the amount of \$104,972 which was returned to the one-time reserve upon receipt. We anticipate there will be some level of FEMA reimbursement for this additional work, of an undetermined amount, which would again be returned to the one-time reserve upon receipt of the funds.

Academic Affairs Request for \$185,000 in One-Time Funds for VA Reimbursement

When the Post-9/11 GI Bill was implemented, there was confusion throughout the nation, and in particular in California, with regard to the cap on tuition reimbursement from the VA. California's cap was supposed to be set at the cost of the most expensive public institution in California which is UC Berkeley. However, Berkeley is on a trisemester, resulting in a lower per-term cost than SDSU. Further complicating the reimbursement calculation is that prior to this year, California only charged "fees" and not tuition fees. This did not present a VA reimbursement problem for resident students. However, for out-of-state students, SDSU charged the maximum allowable fees and non-resident tuition cost to the fee category and the balance of non-resident tuition to the tuition category.

During our recent VA compliance survey, we were told that the CSU Chancellor's Office procedure for charging fees and non-resident tuition was incorrect. That is, we should have been reporting the State University Fee (now tuition fee) and any non-resident tuition in the tuition category and other fees in the fee category. Over the last two years, SDSU's fee and non-resident tuition procedures have been inspected twice by James Vanderbilt, State Approving Agency Specialist and Bob Curry, VA Compliance Auditor before this most recent compliance survey. We were not told that we were certifying our non-resident students incorrectly. If we had known we were making submissions in error over a year ago, most of this overpayment would have been prevented.

As a result of the most current VA audit, it has been determined that there was an overpayment in allowable VA tuition reimbursement of approximately \$185,000. Rather than go back and charge the student veterans for those funds, we are requesting \$185,000 in one-time funds to reimburse the VA for the non-resident tuition overpayments charged to the VA. As a "footnote" to this issue, it is of interest to note that beginning August 2011 the VA will no longer pay any non-resident tuition costs.

<u>Academic Affairs Request for \$143,000 in Ongoing Funds and \$57,613 in</u> <u>Additional One-Time Out-of-State Recruitment Funds</u>

In order to significantly increase the number of out-of-state students and thereby increase the university's non-resident tuition revenue, Enrollment Services must scale up its out-of-state recruitment staffing and resources. Therefore, Academic Affairs is requesting the following funds for out-of-state recruitment:
