## Associate Vice President for Global Affairs

San Diego State University seeks an experienced and accomplished leader to serve as Associate Vice President for Global Affairs. This position reports directly to the Provost and Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and is a key member of the University's leadership team. This position is integral to the University's commitment to the overall success of global education and engagement, research, and outreach. SDSU's international mission is to develop globally-conscientious leaders through engagement in international educational and research activities and meaningful cultural exchange.

San Diego State University aspires to build on our global educational leadership by leveraging our diversity and geographic location, both in San Diego and in the Imperial Valley, to create accessible, high-quality international experiences for students, faculty, staff, and the broader community. We strive to offer inclusive educational opportunities for scholars and students from around the world through a robust, supportive campus environment, as well as an intellectual community engaged in transformational research in partnership with other top-ranked institutions worldwide.

To pursue this mission, San Diego State University will:

- Provide opportunities for graduate and undergraduate students to participate in a wide range of globally-focused educational opportunities domestically and abroad;
- Create an environment supportive of transnational and globally focused research;
- Enhance undergraduate students' curiosity and competencies to enable them to embrace difference and become inclusive global citizens;
- Facilitate transnational and global collaborations and partnerships;
- Advance and promote the global awareness of SDSU faculty, students, staff, and the community; and,
- Increase the University's presence and recognition globally.

The Associate Vice President provides vision and dynamic leadership for SDSU's comprehensive global strategy, works closely with senior academic and administrative leadership, and leads the development of the University's strategic global partnerships and planning. The Associate Vice President will secure external and internal funding to support activities and programs and represents the University to external constituents at the national and international levels.

The Associate Vice President will lead the division that houses the International Student Center, including International Student Services, the SDSU Study Abroad office, the SDSU Passport Office, the Faculty-Led Study Abroad Office, and the university-wide office that oversees international and global affairs. The portfolio will also include responsibility for initiating activities and programs which support faculty and academic units; developing and overseeing new study abroad endeavors; and, serving and supporting international visiting scholars. Jointly with the College of Extended Studies and other colleges and departments, this position is also responsible for initiating activities and programs which support our engagement with global markets and alumni and for building strategic international partnerships that expand opportunities for global citizens.

#### About SDSU

Now in its 122<sup>nd</sup> year, San Diego State University can take pride in more than a century of achievement in education, research, and service. SDSU ranks No. 60 among public universities, and in the top 130 overall in U.S. News & World Report's annual ranking of America's Best Colleges. SDSU also placed No. 45 nationally on the U.S. News list of "most innovative schools." In fiscal year 2017-18, San Diego State University faculty secured \$135 million in public and private funding—a total of 756 awards to 285 principal investigators.

San Diego State University ranks No. 5 nationally and No. 1 in California for the number of students studying abroad in the latest Institute for International Education's Open Doors report. More than 3,000 students have international experiences each year, choosing from more than 650 programs in 70 countries. San Diego State University has been named a Gilman International Scholarship Top Producing Institution by the U.S. Department of State. The University tied for 14th in the nation among large colleges and universities for the number of students sent abroad through the Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program. Each year, SDSU welcomes more than 3,000 international students from more than 70 countries on five continents.

## Candidate Qualifications

Qualified candidates will possess relevant comprehensive international higher education experience, including instructional, student services, and administrative experience. This experience will include leadership and supervisory experience, strategic planning and execution, and a track record of securing internal and external funding. Advanced degree required; terminal degree and faculty experience preferred.

### Diversity and Inclusion

At SDSU, diversity and excellence go hand-in-hand. The University celebrates diversity and inclusion, embracing a broad definition of diversity that includes people of every race, religion, gender, ethnicity, veterans, people with varying abilities, and members of the LGBTQ+community.
