SCHOOL OF MUSIC AND DANCE:

The School of Music and Dance, in the College of Professional Studies and Fine Arts, offers curriculum leading to the Bachelor of Music, Bachelor of Arts in Music, Bachelor of Arts in Dance, and the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance degree. Graduate Study degree programs include a Master of Arts degree in Music the Master of Music and a graduate Artist Diploma. The 78,000 square-foot music building includes a 295-seat recital hall, a number of large and small ensemble rehearsal rooms, electronic music studio, three digital/interactive class piano rooms, over 50 individual practice rooms, and a 25 station interactive multi-media computer technology laboratory. The School includes 16 full-time, and approximately 30 part-time faculty with a support staff of 8. There are approximately 250 undergraduate and 50 graduate students.
